Events:

SIGN IN - FOOD AND DRINKS/VISIT WITH NEIGHBORS - The social segment began at 6:30 PM. Sandwiches, drinks, chips, and cookies were provided by NCPNA. A slide show of past neighborhood events was provided by John and Phyllis.

WELCOME FROM RUSSELL BOWEN, PRESIDENT - The meeting was called to order at 7:04 PM. Russell's appreciative welcome preceded the following reports:

MEMBERSHIP REPORT - 105 residents are currently dues paying members of NCPNA. Some are paid up for two years.

TREASURER'S REPORT - The current account balance is \$2,970.32. A copy of the Financial Report from September 1, 2017 until April 25, 2018 was handed out and gone over carefully.

EVENTS, PROJECTS AND ACTIVITIES - Russell went over a number of events and accomplishments that were sponsored by NCPNA. It included two outdoor live music events, holiday decorations, Crime Watch Patrollers Party, Yard of the Month awards, a new park bench on Bowser, and the Trash Bash event. Other events, including National Night Out, Spring Celebration, and the four neighborhood garage sale, were co-sponsored with Glenville Park, College Park, and Town North. Upcoming events include Fourth of July decorations, parade and picnic, Labor Day Potluck lunch, and the June 2018 - May 2019 Membership Drive.

Russell mentioned that the Association is always looking for volunteers to help out. Also to encourage ideas that will promote the mission of the Association to "build a sense of community, increase safety, and enhance beautification."

CRIME WATCH PATROL - Russell went through the last four months of incidents and stated that while low, that "zero would be better." He also encouraged residents to become patrollers.

GUEST SPEAKER - Russell then introduced the Guest Speaker, Lindsay Turman. She is a Community Services Administrator for the City of Richardson. The topic of her

presentation was city code compliance. Among many observations, she said the issue Richardson citizens care the most about and cause the most heated discussions with the city is vegetation. After the presentation, Lindsay answered a number of audience questions about the details of code compliance

ELECTION OF THE 2017/2018 BOARD OF DIRECTORS - Sandy presented the Slate of Ten NCPNA - Board of Directors for 2018-2019. After they were presented, a motion was made to elect the slate.
